Tractor Pull

Rules and Regulations

All drivers and vehicles must conform to rules as set out by the committee, or you will be immediately disqualified from the event.

A speed limit of 10km/hr is to be strictly observed on grounds at all times.

All decisions of track official will be final.

1. Operators must remain seated during the pull and have complete control of tractor at all times.
2. No Driver shall be under the influence of alcohol or illegal narcotics prior to pulling.
3. The class in which a tractor pulls will be based on the weight of tractor with the driver who must be at least 16 (sixteen) years of age.
4. Pullers must be registered, with a number visible on left side and have signed the waiver prior to pulling. Cost to pull is \$20.00. Every registered puller is guaranteed one hook. Maximum pullers per class is 25. (Classes may allow for more than 25 pullers if other classes are not at maximum and under the discretion of the pulling committee).
5. All tractors must be registered prior to 12:30 p.m. start of event and pull in order of sign up/ registration. Operators will be required to sign a waiver at that time.
6. All stock tractors must burn only stock fuel.
7. All Drivers required a helmet, DOT approved helmet No bike helmets allowed.

8. NO passengers at any time during pulls and weigh in.
9. Tractors must be weighed and inspected prior to pulling..
10. All weights must be securely bolted if on rear wheels. Weight brackets and hand weights are allowed. If a weight or bracket falls off during a pull, that puller will be disqualified in that class.
11. You will have 2 minutes to get to your position in line before your pull.
12. All vehicles must be in neutral or park while being hitched and unhitched.
13. Hitch point must be a maximum height of 20 (twenty) inches from top hitching devices parallel to ground. Draw bar is to be stationary in all directions.
14. All pulls must start with a tight hitch. Contestants will be allowed two consecutive attempts at a 75 (seventy) feet to start sled.
15. All vehicles stop immediately upon judges signal. Any vehicles going out of bounds will be disqualified.
16. A pull of 300 feet is considered a full pull, finish will be determined on a floating finish thereafter.
