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RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Each Exhibitor will have their own Exhibitor number given by the Secretary.
2. A membership fee of \$5.00 covers entry fee for exhibits only. Admission rates on fair day shall be posted. All Exhibitors at the fair must be members of the Tiverton Agricultural Society, except where otherwise stated.
3. Entry forms are to be handed in to the Secretary or entered online.
4. Articles to be exhibited in the hall, may be brought Thursday Evening from 7 pm – 9 pm or Friday Morning from 9 am - 11:30 a.m. All exhibits must be set up and the hall vacated by 12:00pm. **EXHIBITS MUST REMAIN IN THE ARENA UNTIL 4:30PM ON SATURDAY. ANY EXHIBITS REMOVED BEFORE THEN WILL FORFEIT THE PRIZE MONEY.** The Society is not responsible for exhibits that are not removed by 5 pm Saturday unless arrangements have been made between the exhibitor and Society.
5. Ensure that entries and entry numbers are correct before placing on exhibits. Please ask for assistance, if needed.
6. All entries must be the property of the person in whose name they are entered. In case of a protest, an affidavit will be demanded. No bought or borrowed goods will be allowed. No artificial intelligence (AI) images will be accepted.
7. No soiled articles will be accepted for competition, the judges will be instructed to award prizes to the new and up-to-date work. No AI work will be accepted.
8. When a certain number is called for on the list, exhibitors must not show more or less. All exhibits must be in accordance with prize list.
9. Each competitor shall be allowed but one prize for the same kind of grain or any kind of domestic produce or manufacture. Only one exhibit per Exhibitor is allowed per Section/Class in each Division.
10. Exhibitors winning prizes to the amount of \$10.00 or over, shall have a membership of \$5.00 for the next year deducted from their cheque.
11. Exhibitors awarded prizes shall apply to the Treasurer on or before December 15, or forfeit such prizes. In case of paid prizes being by cheque, it must be presented at the bank not later than December 20, after which date, cheque will not be honoured. All vouchers must be cashed by December 20th unless otherwise dated.
12. No entry fee will be taken off children's prize money unless they have entered an open class and winnings are \$5.00 or over.

13. When there is no competition or only one article exhibited, it is to the discretion of the judge to award prize or not.
14. The judges shall use their discretion in awarding prizes to such articles as they consider worthy, not enumerated in the Prize List, and directors shall determine the amount of the premium. The judges shall also endeavour to place all entries in their proper class, if wrongly entered.
15. Judges are requested to report to the Secretary before entering on their duties, where they will be furnished with badges. Judges are requested to return badges as soon as their duties are finished. Judging starts at 1 pm Friday.
16. Judges have the discretion to award 2 – 1st prizes, etc. were application. Numerous entries could cause classes to be judged and then split.
17. Persons using abusive or insulting language to the judges will forfeit prize money and be expelled from the Society.
18. While the Directors will take every precaution to secure articles which are brought in, the owners themselves, must take the risk of exhibiting. Should any article/animal be accidentally lost, injured or stolen, the Directors will give assistance within their power towards the recovery but will make no payment towards the value.
19. In case of error in printing of the Prize List, the Directors have power to rectify the error.
20. In case of unfavourable weather, or other reasons, causing receipts to fall short of paying expenses and all prizes in full, a proportionate amount, exclusive of membership fees, will be deducted from such prizes to enable the Directors to balance the accounts without loss to the Society. The Directors feel that this course is the most equitable and fair one. Any deduction will fall proportionately on those participating, in the amount collected, and not leave the whole to be a debt to bear heavily on the Society and thus impair its usefulness.
21. Exhibitors are expected to give the secretary or judge any information that may be required in regard to any animal shown.
22. For your own protection - all horses must have a negative Coggins Test certificate (taken in the current year).
23. The Society will not be responsible for any person or persons injured at the Fair.
24. Livestock Exhibitors must carry their own liability insurance.

Please note that the Tiverton Agricultural Society, any associate groups or agents will not be responsible for any accident or damage caused to or by any horse on the grounds and that each horse owner is responsible for their own liability insurance. Each contestant will be required to sign a waiver to this affect when entering competition.
2. All Junior Exhibitors must have a parent or legal guardian sign their entry form before participating in the show.
3. \$5.00 membership to be paid with entries.
4. Entry numbers \$1.00.
5. Registration for Saddle Horse Show will be held between 9 am - 10 am.
6. Classes to start at 10 a.m.
7. All proper safety equipment is required.
8. All exhibitors 18 years of age and younger while on a horse in the Tiverton Fair Grounds are required by law to wear an A.S.T.M./S.E.I. approved helmet. Western hats may still be worn in showmanship classes
9. Juniors will be 15 years and under as of January 1, 2026.
10. Rules will be left to the judge's discretion.
11. One rider per horse per class.
12. Entry fee \$4.00 per class.
13. Novice may be any age, but is limited to people in first or second year of showing, not more.
14. There will be no refund for class withdrawals after paid registration received.
15. Disqualification will result to any rider using profanity or arguing with the Judge or Ring Steward. No refund will be given for the class in question or any which follows. The Judge's decision is final.

TIVERTON FALL FAIR QUILT 2026

“Home on the Farm”

Each year for the Tiverton Fall Fair, held on the first weekend of October, Jane Kelley and Katherine Gowing come together to create a beautiful queen-size quilt that becomes one of the fair’s highlights.

The quilt is made up of approximately 30 squares, with the fabric carefully selected from Sanity Hill. Thirty fabric packages are then prepared, complete with instructions explaining the fabric choices, colours, and overall theme for the year.

Quilters are invited to participate through local connections and the Quilters Guild, and each participant takes home a package to create their block. This year, 29 talented women came together to help create the quilt, showcasing incredible creativity, dedication, and craftsmanship.

As a small thank you for their time and talent, each quilter receives three raffle tickets, giving them the opportunity to put their own name into the draw to win the finished quilt.

It takes approximately 250 hours of combined volunteer time to complete the quilt each year. Once all the blocks are finished, the quilt is assembled and completed with the help of several talented women. Diane Clifford of Ripley provides the machine quilting, Katherine Gowing completes the binding, and Jane Kelley carefully does the hand stitching to finish the quilt.

The tradition first began in the basement of the Presbyterian Church in Tiverton. As the project grew over the years, it was eventually moved to the basement of the Tiverton Park Manor to allow more space for everyone working together.

Each year, Katherine prints approximately 1,200 raffle tickets for the quilt draw. Interest in the quilts has been tremendous over the years. During Canada’s 150th birthday celebrations, tickets completely sold out. The same thing happened again last year with the 2025 bird-themed quilt, when more than 1,000 tickets were sold out due to overwhelming support from the community.

This quilt project has become a wonderful tradition that brings together talented quilters, community spirit, and countless hours of volunteer work — all helping make the Tiverton Fall Fair such a special event each year.
